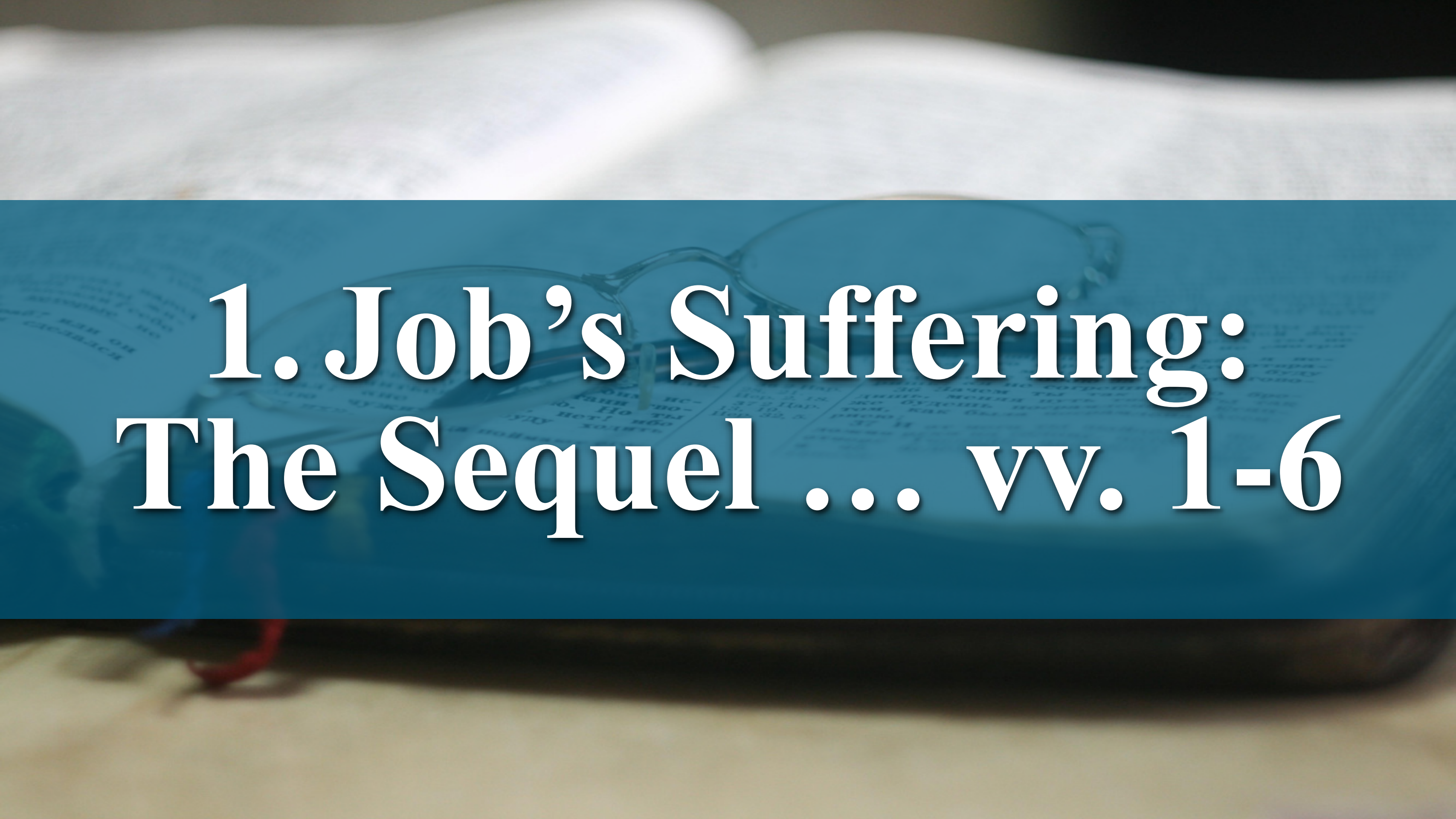
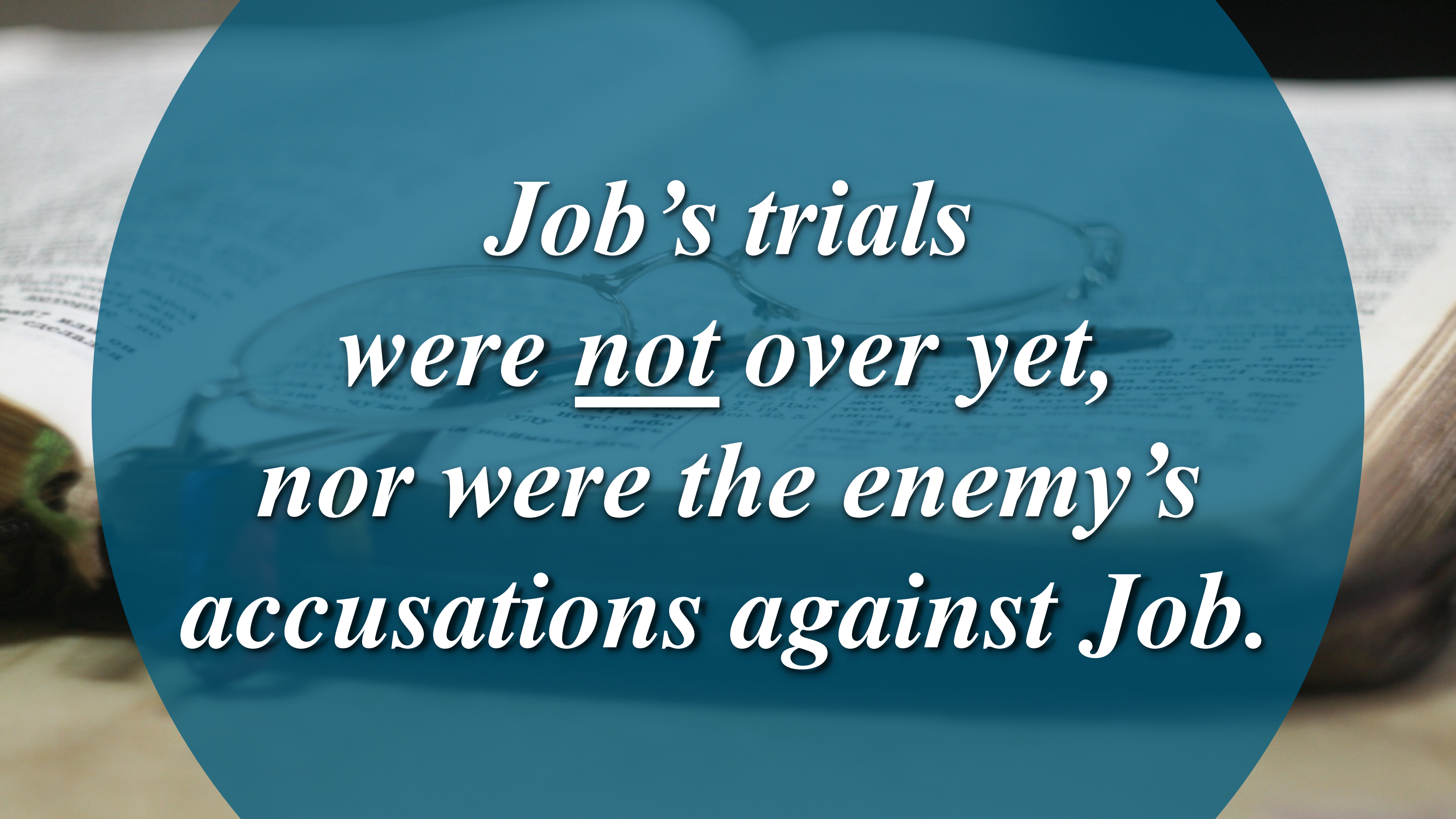

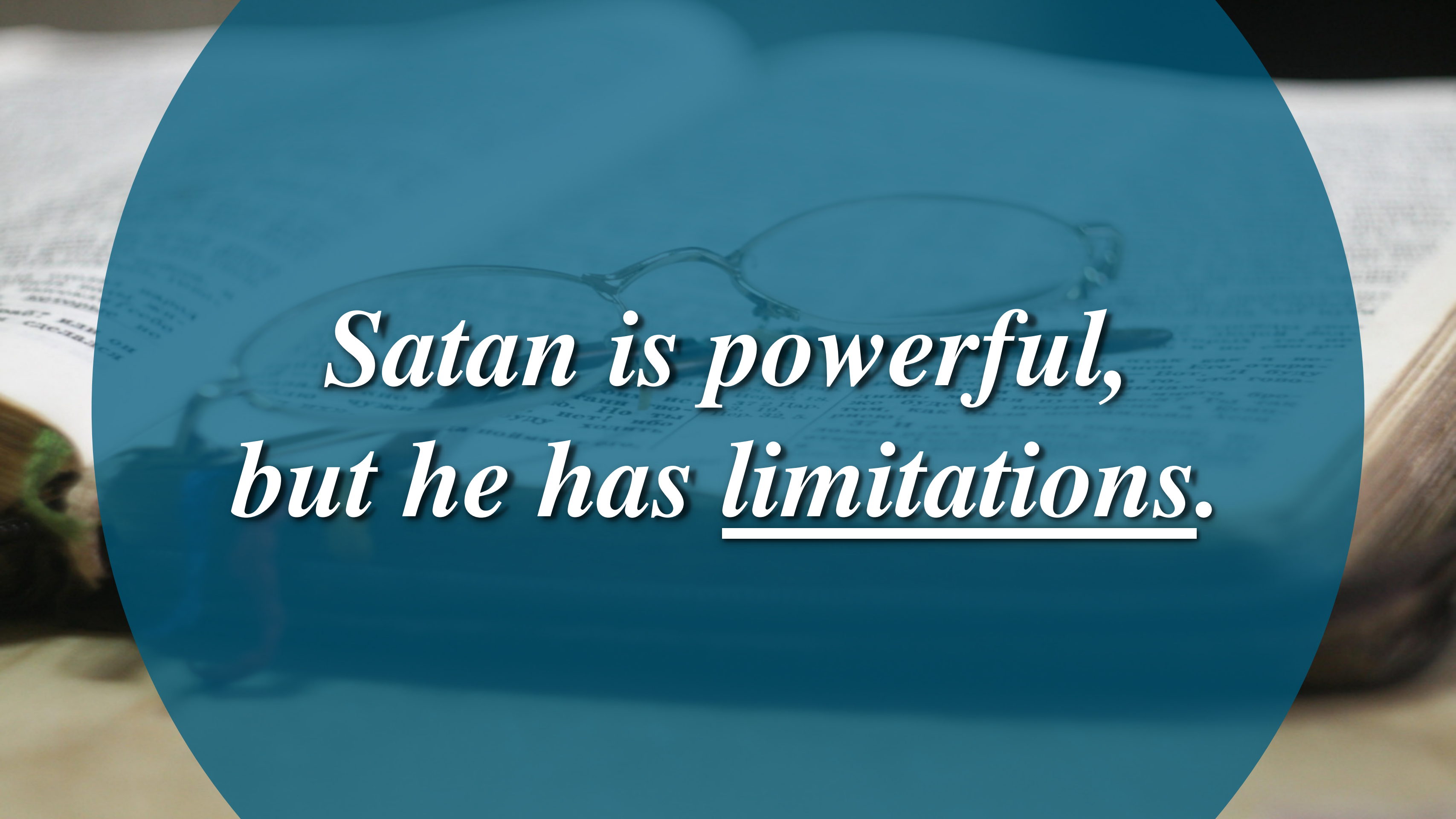

1. Job's Suffering: The Sequel ... vv. 1-6

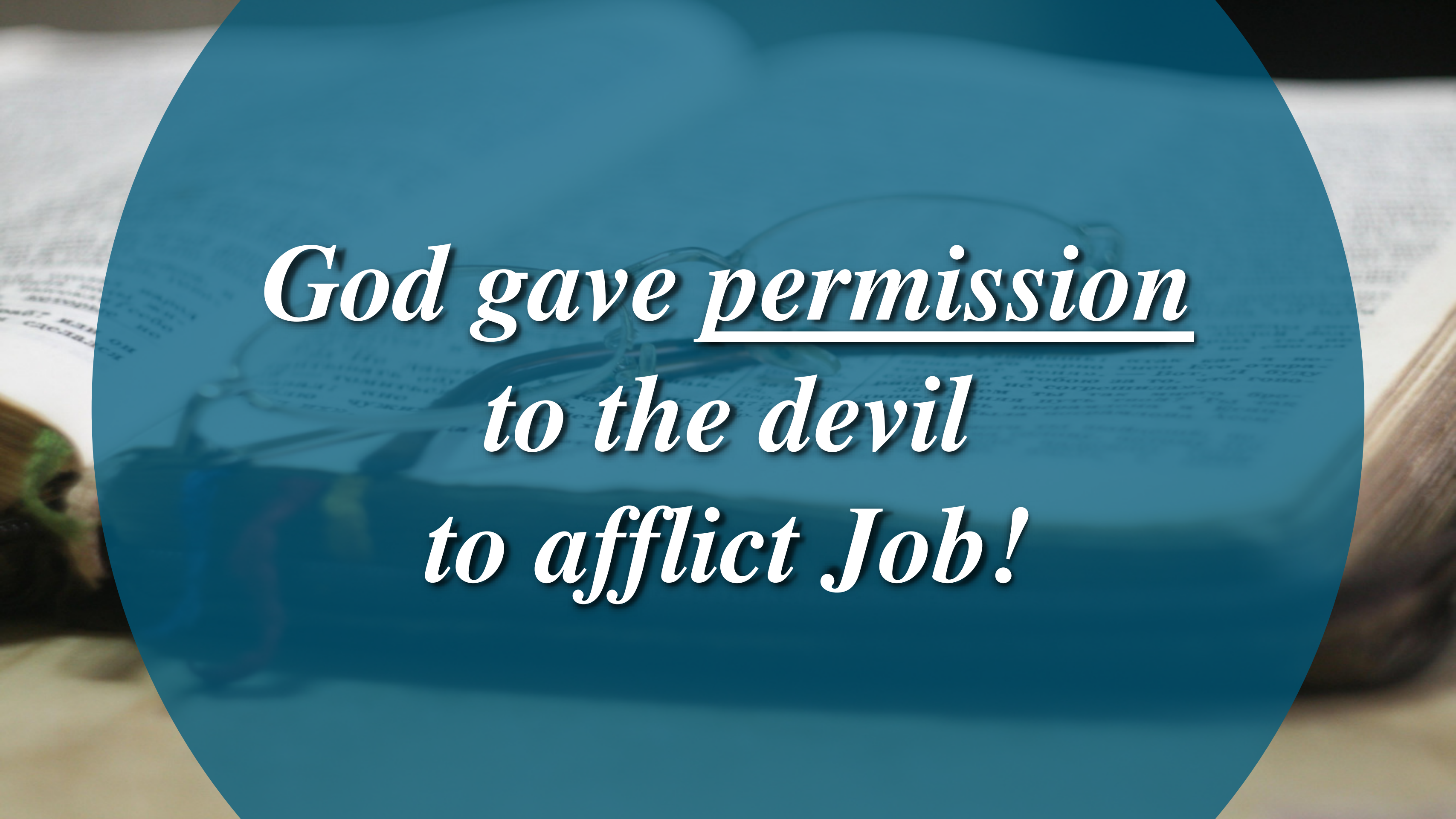

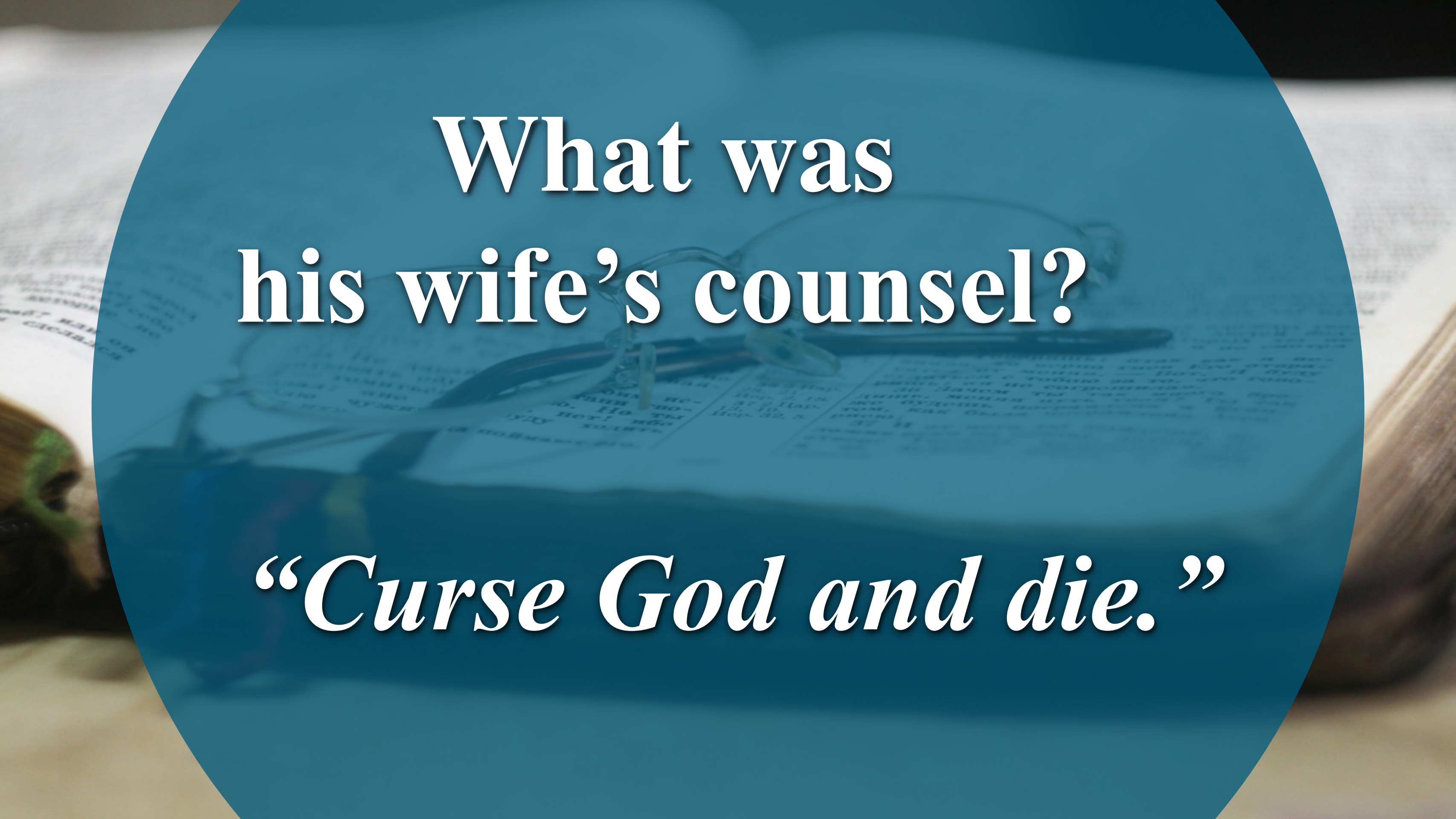
2. Job's Wife: The Speech ... vv. 7-10
